"Ordinary Time"

This is what we call the long, green season from the 2nd Sunday after Pentecost to the end of November when Advent begins. The lectionary for Sunday Scriptures focuses not on pivotal moments of Jesus' life on earth but rather on his ministry and his teachings. Be listening for what you might need to learn for your growth in faith. It is green for growing! It is green to remind us that we are wonderfully alive in Christ.

"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" 2 Corinthians 5:17

This newness is ongoing all through our lives as we learn to love more, forgive often, judge less and bring a healing word to the world. Imagine if you will, as the dry season of summer approaches and the threat of 'wildfire looms', both as physical fire and spiritual strife that rage. Imagine that you and I are a kind of oasis. Ideally, all who follow Jesus are nourished by "living waters" that come from the Spirit of God. So while the world around us swirls with confusion and the struggle to find meaning and peace, we find our peace in knowing Christ and the love of God. We find our refreshment in coming together to worship. We find that the kingdom of God is at hand and that hope and love are real things. In the green season we remember God's desire that we keep growing into image bearers of the Son of God. There is nothing "Ordinary" about a time such as this!


Name Tags


